PLANTINGS FOR EASTERN BLUEBIRDS

Below we have listed the trees/shrubs that produce berries/fruit that Eastern Bluebirds have been observed eating. All of these species will grow in at least one hardiness zone of New York State. All are considered native, non-invasive species and are recommended for planting on your property. Before purchasing, please check with your local nursery or Cooperative Extension to be sure they are rated to grow in your hardiness zone. We encourage you to be environmentally responsible by planting native species. **Note:** Although poison ivy is a native species and birds will utilize the berries, we do not recommend planting it due to its toxicity to humans
